We can improve our knowledge and skills in order to impact how fast this process of transformation moves. **Voice and Dialogue Training empowers us to act.**

The North East Recovery Learning Community (NERLC) of the Northeast Independent Living Program and the National Empowerment Center are partnering to present a training for persons who would like to learn to conduct the Finding Our Voice and Using it in Dialogue Groups. We are seeking people who have one or more of the following:

- identify as mental health services clients/consumers/survivors
- come from diverse backgrounds
- have lived experience of homelessness, the criminal justice system, being in an inpatient facility, and/or co-occurring conditions (substance abuse)
- display qualities of leadership in their local self-help/peer support organizations and/or have been involved in planning and policy-making for the various mental health system components
- have experience conducting training through workshops and conferences

The first session will take place on Tuesday, November 23, 9:30am – 11:30 am at the Wakefield Public Library in Wakefield, MA. The remaining 8 sessions will take place at the same time and place on Tuesdays, including November 30, December 7, December 14, December 21 and January dates to be announced.
