*Clinical and Behavioral Specialist with Deaf Services  
at Advocates Inc in Massachusetts.*

- Dr. Glickman was, for 17 years, the co-director or director of a specialty Deaf psychiatric unit. He is the co-editor of two books about psychotherapy and mental health care with Deaf people. He is also the author of Cognitive Behavioral Therapy with Deaf and Hearing Persons with Language and Learning Challenges. He consults to Deaf schools and mental health programs throughout the United States and is adjunct faculty in the graduate rehabilitation program at Assumption College. He is currently at work on a fourth book on mental health care of Deaf people.

**Mary T. Weiner, Ph.D.-Olweus Bullying Prevention Program** trainer. Professor, Psychology Department, Gallaudet University.

-Dr. Weiner is a professor with the Department of Psychology at Gallaudet University. Dr. Weiner graduated from NCSD. She received her bachelor's degree in psychology from Lenoir-Rhyne College and her master's degree in school psychology from Gallaudet University. Her 1997 doctoral degree from University of Maryland is in human development. Dr. Weiner has been with Gallaudet University for 20 years. She served as the Board Chair of a non-profit organization providing services for D.C. deaf women who experienced domestic violence and/or sexual assault.

## Conference Highlights

**What is the Same and What is Different About the Mental Health Care of Deaf People?**

**Neil Glickman, PhD, CRC- Licensed Psychologist**  
*Clinical and Behavioral Specialist with Deaf Services at Advocates Inc in Massachusetts.*

Dr. Glickman will reflect on his 17 years as director or co-director of a specialty Deaf psychiatric inpatient unit and describe some of the key lessons learned. He will describe the emerging specialty of mental health work with Deaf people, including how it is similar to and different from mental health care of hearing people.

### Breakout Groups:

- ◆ "Bullying and Its Impact on Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children" by **Mary T. Weiner, Ph.D.-Olweus Bullying Prevention Program.**

Research on the impact of bullying on this population will be discussed, including the characteristics of Deaf and Hard of Hearing victims and bullies, various types of school settings Deaf and Hard of Hearing children attend, bullying dynamics that may be unique to this population and its peers, and other environmental factors.

- ◆ "Introduction to Cognitive Behavioral Therapy with Language and Learning Challenged Clients" **Neil Glickman, PhD, CRC-**

This workshop will present an introduction to the adaptations of CBT that were developed on the Westborough Deaf Unit for work with language and learning challenged deaf clients. The first half will be an extensive discussion of coping skills that are relevant to these clients. The second half will be a review of the 4 main strategies that were used to develop their coping skills. The presenter will also show dozens of the pictorial tools (skill cards) that were developed by Deaf artist and communication specialist Michael Krajnak to illustrate coping skills to persons with poor ability to read English. A DVD developed with clients in which they illustrate and teach coping skills will be shown.
